Phase II of the **National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES)** Storm Water Regulations will be implemented in March 2003. Everyone involved with construction activity in the United States needs to thoroughly understand the implications of this landmark legislation.

FINAL RULE

Sediment migration from construction sites is one of the primary targets of the tough new standards mandated by the EPA under the NPDES Phase II Final Rule.

The new legislation is far-reaching and will impact nearly every significant project in the United States.

For everyone involved in earth moving operations, knowledge of the law and its impact is of prime importance. Responsibility for compliance reaches from property owners to developers, designers and installers.

The Phase II rules represent a significant stiffening of the standards established under the Water Quality Act of 1987. While Phase I standards regulate construction activity on sites of five acres or more, the new rule requires compliance on sites of just one acre or larger.

Sound erosion and sediment control practices have always made economic sense. Millions of dollars are spent each year reconstructing slopes, dredging channels and rebuilding shorelines that have been severely eroded by rainfall events and storm water runoff. The NPDES Phase II rules simply recognize that smaller construction sites significantly add to these problems.

A thorough understanding of the Best Management Practices (BMPs) for erosion and sediment control is essential for compliance with the new environmental standards. The rapid evolution of erosion and sediment control technology underscores the importance of public awareness regarding the environmental impact of storm water runoff.
